Policy on Mentoring of Students in the University

Netaji Subhas University (NSU) is committed to fostering student success through various mentoring programs tailored to meet diverse needs. These initiatives aim to support students academically, professionally, and personally throughout their university journey.

Student Mentoring Programs at NSU:

- Learning Assistance Programs Mentoring: NSU's Learning Assistance Programs
 provide mentors to guide students during their academic pursuits. Mentors assist in
 facilitating workshops and events in collaboration with the First Year Experience,
 Second Year Experience, Learning Communities, and the NSU Writing Center.
 Departments, faculty, and staff can request mentors for events and workshops via the
 Mentor Request Form available on the resources page.
- 2. Undergraduate Research and Mentorship (URM) Program: The URM Program pairs undergraduate majors with faculty mentors to introduce students to academic professions and foster scholarly development. It's ideal for students aspiring to careers in academia, publishing, or program development. Participants work closely with faculty, ideally over at least two years, to engage in research projects and professional growth.
- 3. "Every Student Deserves A Mentor" Initiative: In partnership with Mentor Collective, NSU offers incoming first-year students the opportunity to be paired with faculty or staff mentors. This program aims to help students achieve goals, build connections, and prepare for future careers. Mentors and mentees are matched based on interests and preferences, with a commitment to regular check-ins throughout the academic year.

The objectives of mentoring under a mentor-mentee policy typically focus on fostering a supportive, developmental relationship between the mentor and the mentee. While specific policies may vary between institutions or organizations, the following are common objectives of mentoring programs:
