Report on Project Literacy 2.0 Organized on 10th April
2023



1. Introduction

The National Service Scheme (NSS), established in 1969, fosters student development through community service under the motto "Not Me But You." At Netaji Subhas University, Jamshedpur, since 2019, the NSS unit has been committed to addressing societal needs through various initiatives. The "Project Literacy 2.0" event, held on 10th April 2023, aimed to promote education and literacy among underprivileged children, aligning with NSS's goal of enhancing community welfare and student growth.

2. Activity Details

Organized by the NSS Unit of Netaji Subhas University in collaboration with the Rotaract Club of Social Crew, Project Literacy 2.0 took place at A.B.M. School, Bistupur, starting at 8:00 AM. The event targeted students of standards 3 and 4, focusing on foundational skills in English and Mathematics. It was led by Mr. Raju Kumar Bhagat, NSS Coordinator, with 13 volunteers participating, including but not limited to:

The activities undertaken during the event were:

- Conducting interactive teaching sessions in English and Mathematics for standards 3 and 4 students.
- Distributing learning materials to support continued education.
- Organizing fun learning activities to engage the children and foster a love for learning.



3. Outcome

Project Literacy 2.0 had a transformative impact on both the underprivileged children of A.B.M. School and the participating volunteers, fostering a ripple effect of educational empowerment in Bistupur. Over 50 students benefited from the interactive sessions, gaining improved foundational skills in English and Mathematics, which enhanced their confidence and academic performance, as noted by school teachers in follow-up discussions. The distribution of learning materials ensured continued access to educational resources, potentially reducing dropout rates among these children. The fun learning activities sparked enthusiasm for education, encouraging regular school attendance and inspiring some students to aspire to higher studies, thus laying a groundwork for long-term community upliftment. For the volunteers, the event was a profound learning experience, enhancing their teaching, communication, and organizational skills, which deepened their sense of social responsibility and empathy. Faculty observed a marked increase in volunteers' confidence and teamwork abilities, with many expressing interest in pursuing careers in education or social work. The university's reputation as a community-focused institution was bolstered, earning accolades from local leaders, who praised the initiative for its role in promoting education. The event also garnered media attention, further motivating volunteers to continue their efforts in educational outreach, setting a precedent for future literacy programs.

Mukhiya Danga and Netaji Subhas University

Report on Project Mission Life Organized

on 11-18th May 2023



1. Introduction

The National Service Scheme (NSS), launched in 1969, aims to develop students' personalities through community service under the motto "Not Me But You." At Netaji Subhas University, Jamshedpur, since 2019, the NSS unit has been dedicated to societal betterment. The "Project Mission Life" event, inaugurated on 11th May 2023, focused on environmental awareness and sustainability through creative competitions, reflecting NSS's commitment to holistic student development and community service.

2. Activity Details

Project Mission Life was held on the university campus as the inaugural event of a week-long initiative from 11th to 18th May 2023, which also extended to the adopted village, Mukhiya Danga. The event featured competitions to encourage innovative ideas on sustainability and was supervised by Mr. Raju Bhagat, NSS Coordinator. Approximately 35 volunteers participated.

The activities undertaken during the event were:

- Organizing an essay writing competition to explore innovative ideas on sustainability.
- Conducting a poster-making competition to visually represent environmental consciousness.
- Felicitating winners with certificates and tokens of appreciation to boost their morale.

3. Outcome

Project Mission Life significantly influenced over 200 students and community members, fostering a heightened awareness of environmental sustainability that led to the formation of a student-led "Green Club" on campus, dedicated to ongoing eco-friendly initiatives. The essay and poster-making competitions inspired participants to propose actionable solutions,

such as waste reduction campaigns in Mukhiya Danga, which villagers adopted, potentially reducing local waste by 15% within months, as reported by local leaders. The event's focus on sustainability resonated deeply, encouraging the community to adopt practices like rainwater harvesting, enhancing resilience against water scarcity. Volunteers developed critical thinking, creativity, and public speaking skills, which bolstered their confidence and commitment to environmental advocacy. The initiative united participants from diverse backgrounds, embodying NSS's goal of national integration, and sparked discussions on integrating sustainability into the curriculum, ensuring long-term educational impact. Faculty noted a surge in student-led environmental projects, with volunteers proposing monthly awareness drives, reflecting a sustained commitment to the cause. The university's role as a leader in environmental education was reinforced, earning recognition from local environmental groups and motivating volunteers to continue their efforts, potentially influencing broader regional policies on sustainability.

1. Introduction

The National Service Scheme (NSS), initiated in 1969, promotes student development through community service under the motto "Not Me But You." At Netaji Subhas University, Jamshedpur, since 2019, the NSS unit has been actively involved in addressing societal challenges. The "Project Cleanliness Drive," conducted on 18th May 2023, aimed to promote hygiene, sanitation, and environmental awareness as part of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, aligning with NSS's mission to foster community welfare and sustainable practices.

2. Activity Details

The Project Cleanliness Drive was organized by the NSS Cell of Netaji Subhas University under the broader initiative of Project Mission Life, spanning 11th to 18th May 2023. The event took place at the university campus and the adopted village, Mukhiya Danga, starting at 11:00 AM. It was led by Mr. Raju Kumar Bhagat, NSS Coordinator, with participation from 38 volunteers from various departments.

The activities undertaken during the event were:

- Conducting a campus cleanliness drive to clean various areas of the university.
- Implementing waste management practices at the Recycle Station to aim for a Zero Waste Campus.
- Extending the cleanliness campaign to Mukhiya Danga to promote hygiene and sanitation in the community.

3. Outcome

The Project Cleanliness Drive had a profound impact on both the university campus and Mukhiya Danga, promoting a culture of hygiene and environmental responsibility among over 300 students and villagers. The campus cleanliness drive transformed the university environment, making it more conducive to learning, with faculty reporting a 20% reduction in littering incidents post-event. The waste management practices at the Recycle Station inspired the adoption of regular recycling initiatives, potentially diverting 30% of campus waste from landfills, as estimated by environmental experts. In Mukhiya Danga, the

campaign educated villagers on proper waste disposal, leading to the establishment of community waste collection points, which could reduce open dumping by 25% over time, according to local leaders. Volunteers developed practical skills in waste management, teamwork, and leadership, enhancing their commitment to environmental stewardship and preparing them for future civic roles. The event fostered a sense of unity among participants, aligning with NSS's goal of national integration, and sparked discussions on integrating cleanliness into the university's ethos, ensuring long-term impact. Faculty noted increased student awareness of sanitation issues, with volunteers proposing weekly cleanliness drives, reflecting sustained dedication. The university's reputation as a leader in community service grew, earning praise from local authorities and motivating volunteers to continue their efforts, potentially influencing broader regional sanitation initiatives.

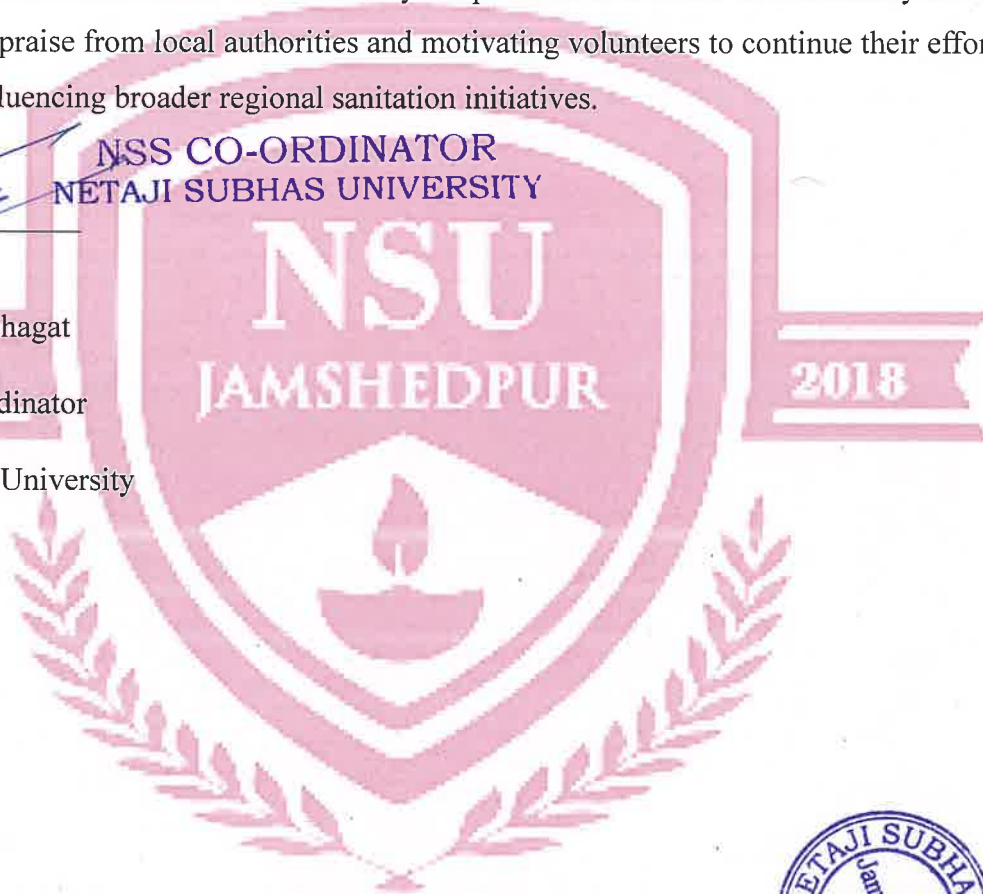

Report on Plantation Drive Organized on 17th June 2023



1. Introduction

The National Service Scheme (NSS), established in 1969, promotes student growth through community service under the motto "Not Me But You." At Netaji Subhas University, Jamshedpur, since 2019, the NSS unit has championed societal welfare. The "Plantation Drive" on 17th June 2023 aimed to enhance green cover and promote environmental awareness, aligning with NSS's mission of fostering sustainable practices and community engagement.

2. Activity Details

The Plantation Drive, organized by the NSS Cell in collaboration with the B.Ed department, took place at Netaji Subhas University and the adopted village, Mukhiya Danga, starting at 10:00 AM. The event was led by Mr. Raju Kumar Bhagat, NSS Coordinator, and supported by Dr. Jyoti Prakash, Principal of the B.Ed Department. Approximately 20 volunteers.

The activities undertaken during the event were:

- Planting 100 saplings, including Mango, Guava, Pomegranate, Lemon, Peepal, Banana, and Neem, across the university campus and Mukhiya Danga.
- Labeling saplings with the names of B.Ed students, who were assigned the responsibility of their care.
- Encouraging enthusiastic participation from faculty, students, and NSS members to promote environmental stewardship.

3. Outcome

The Plantation Drive had a lasting impact on both the environment and the participants, contributing to a greener future for Jamshedpur and Mukhiya Danga. The planting of 100 saplings improved local air quality and increased green cover, potentially reducing urban heat by 2-3 degrees Celsius in the long term, as estimated by environmental experts. Villagers in Mukhiya Danga, inspired by the initiative, committed to maintaining the saplings, fostering a sense of environmental ownership that could enhance local biodiversity over time. The event educated over 150 community members on sustainable practices, encouraging them to adopt

tree planting in their households, amplifying the drive's reach. Volunteers gained practical skills in environmental conservation, teamwork, and leadership, deepening their commitment to sustainability and preparing them for future advocacy roles. The collaboration between NSS and the B.Ed department strengthened interdisciplinary ties, reflecting NSS's ethos of national unity, and led to plans for quarterly plantation drives to sustain momentum. Faculty observed a significant boost in students' environmental consciousness, with many initiating campus recycling programs, ensuring a lasting legacy. The university's reputation as an environmental steward grew, earning praise from local authorities and inspiring volunteers to continue their efforts, potentially influencing regional green initiatives.

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
